Principal's Message

From Jan. 24-26, Iker Pojoy, Roberto Garcia, Omar Rivera, Itzel Hernandez, and Elizabeth Chavez, visited the Florida State Capitol accompanied by Mr. Cesar, Ms. Diana, and Ms. Brown. The scholars were selected based on their academic excellence and interviewed before getting the opportunity to meet Representative Melony M. Bell. During the visit, the scholars presented a mock bill in a Senate hearing proposing that gum be allowed in schools. The bill received three votes in favor and one against. The visit provided the scholars with a valuable experience and a better understanding of the legislative process, and an opportunity to represent their community and share their perspectives with elected officials. They returned home with a greater knowledge of how the government works and their role in shaping policy.
