Growth, Community, Life

Prior to Winter Break, our 5th/6th grade Junior Grange members had the wonderful opportunity to visit Sweetwater Organic Community Farm in Tampa. This hands-on experience gave scholars a deeper understanding of the importance and challenges of organic farming and how food, nature, and community are all connected.

Scholars tasted fresh star fruit, mustard greens, and the surprisingly sour but delicious Wood Sorrel. While walking the nature trail, they learned to identify native, non-native, and invasive plant species found in Florida. They also spotted quail and chickens and impressed the farm guides by sharing their knowledge of our own RCMA chickens and coop.

Students helped plant seeds and learned the value of community farming, sustainability, and caring for the environment. Each scholar even received seeds to take home and plant, encouraging learning to continue beyond the field trip.
